	After <u>all</u> the above steps are completed 100%, including testing, apply online via Licensing Verification and Information System (LVIS) at https://license.doe.in.gov/ *Complete and upload CPR/Heimlich Maneuver/AED certification or card (both sides). *Complete and upload documentation of Suicide Prevention certification.	
	Allow four to six weeks for Purdue University to evaluate and the Indiana Department of Education (IDOE) to grant the Indiana License.	
	After receipt an Indiana License, apply for out-of-state licensure (if desired).
